I. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:07 pm by President Deborah Johnson.

II. Reading of the Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as amended. Bob Hunt moved to accept the minutes, Joanne Hubble seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Financial Report

Fran Williams presented the Treasurer's Report for the previous month. She noted that:

- The date for the Pet Vaccination Clinic is May 3rd
- The next Swap Meet is set for Saturday, June 28
- A total of \$1257 was donated for the Easter Breakfast Raffle; more than 600 people attended

IV. Committee Reports

A. Fire Safe Council: Mary Schreiber reported that she, Gene Robinson and Dana Judd attended the presentation, at OCFA headquarters, of the "After Fire Report on the Santiago Fire." Several recommendations made in the report have been approved, such as helicopter and a 4th man on responding trucks.

Two grant requests have been approved by the CAFSC:

1. \$250,000 over a ten-year period for community education
2. \$37,000 for the removal of dead/dying trees on private property

Next FSC meeting is April 17, at Station 14.

B. Canyon Watch: Gene Robinson reported he has programmed 4 new radios, with an additional four in the process.

C. Cell Phone Committee: Hank Rodgers reported that Verizon has expressed some interest in providing cell phone service in the canyons.

D. Community Directory: A letter is almost ready to be sent out to Canyon residents.

E. Brown Baggers Seniors Group: This group includes residents of Silverado, Modjeska and Williams Canyons, with a typical attendance of 16-20 members. For the first time, Modjeska folk outnumber those in Silverado.

IV. Old Business

A. SMPRD Report: Bob Hunt announced that no nature walks were set for this weekend, due in part to the closure of the Cleveland National Forest.

B. Deborah Johnson brought up the possible closure of Silverado Elementary School after the 2009-2010 school year. There has been some community interest in turning it into an Environmental Charter School, and is presently meeting with several local residents to discuss financial feasibility, community interest and involvement.

V. New Business

Carl Reinhardt spoke to the group about a new type of fire resistant building material from the No Burn of California company. He will take a group of interested residents to the LAFD Training facility in Los Angeles to see the material and how it performs.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:18 pm.
