INTER-CANYON LEAGUE August 4, 2009 Silverado Community Center

I. Opening: The meeting was opened by President Deborah Johnson at 7:04 p.m.

II. Minutes: The minutes were approved as read.

III. Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's reports for July and August were handed out by Treasurer Fran Williams.

IV. Committee Reports:

A. ICL Santiago Fire Relief Effort: No report.

B. Fire Safe Council:

Mary Schreiber reported that the quarterly report to the California Fire Safe Council has been completed and handed in. Leslie and Mary will meet tomorrow, August 5, with an arborist. Mary and Bob Click were

invited to

speak to the County Parks and Rec. Docent program about the Fire Safe Program. The Council will serve ice cream at the upcoming Saturday

in the

Community Center. Mike Colgan met with the FSC to begin to look at better ways to work with the ICL, and to look at ways to work in a more

timely

fashion with the grant system. Trails4All All Canyons Cleanup is set for Saturday, September 19. **It was moved by Mary Schreiber, seconded by Fran Williams to donate \$250 from ICL and \$250 from FSC to assist Trails4All in this cleanup. The motion passed unanimously.**

C. Canyon Watch:

Gene Robinson reported that the American Red Cross will donate \$20,000 to Canyon Watch. Gene will document how the money is to be spent.

Gene is scheduling a radio net during the Monday nights in August for all Canyon Watch radio operators, as a way to encourage use of the system.

D. Forest Liaison Committee:
Hank Rodgers reported that the building at the end of Silverado Canyon is being staffed intermittently by docent and volunteers of the Santa Ana Mountains Conservancy. The Forestry is establishing a Fire Watch program for this area, presently limited to 20 people.

E. Canyons Community Directory:
The former directory cost up to \$800 to print, and could cost as much as \$1200 in all. Debbie will confer with Laura Bennett and Leslie Paskus and report at the September meeting. Several people present agreed that it would be a good idea to have the new directory available to be sold at the Fair, October 3 and 4, 2009.

V. Old Business

A. SMPRD (Parks and Rec Board)

Bob Hunt reported that the Ore Cart at the now-closed Silverado School has been given into the possession of SMPRD. It will most likely be moved to the Silverado Community Center.

Bob reported that an amount up to \$300,000 being considered by a judge; no determination has yet been made.

B. Silverado School

Debbie reported that 70 responses had been made in favor of re-districting Silverado to the Saddleback School District. Silverado has asked to be on the OUSD meeting agenda sometime in August. So far, the district has not responded.

VI. New Business

A. Joanne Hubble reported that efforts are being made to re-start an Explorer Scout Program, for ages 14-18. A meeting is set for Thursday, August 13, at 6:00 p.m. at Fire Station 16.

B. Fran Williams requested that the Friends of the Library account be moved to the Bank of America branch where all other ICL accounts are presently.

A motion was made by Bob Hunt, seconded by Joanne Hubble that this account be moved. The motion passed unanimously.

C. Because the Library is scheduled to be closed soon for renovations, Fran Williams requested that monies be made available, if needed for boarding Meghan, the Library Cat. **It was moved by Mike Colgan, seconded by Gene Robinson, to provide an amount not to exceed \$50 per week to board the cat until the library reopens. The motion passed**

unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned by Debbie Johnson at 8:29.
