COMMITTEE REPORTS

Fire Safe Council: Mary Schreiber

OCFA held a meeting to discuss setting up of an OC Fire Safe Council or Fire Wise Community. The next meeting will be the third Thursday of August to further discuss the possibility. The RAST: Southern California Regional Area Safety Taskforce meeting in Glendale was not attended. A FSC training workshop is scheduled August 23 and 24, 2010 in Pala, California. Looking for volunteers to attend a 2 day workshop (8:00 – 4:00) Assessing Wildfire Hazards in the Home Ignition Zone, sponsored by the Pacific Regional Office (PRO) of Bureau of Indian Affairs, Pala Reservation and Blue Lake Reservation. Participants will be provided valuable information that will enable them to identify wildfire hazards and how to apply effective fire prevention response and education in wildland urban areas. Workshop modules include: Myths of Wildland/Urban Fire; Understanding Wildland/Urban Fire; Wildfire Hazards in the Home Ignition Zone; Assessing Wildfire Hazards.
