I. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 by President Deborah Johnson.

II. Reading of the Minutes:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved by unanimous voice vote

III. Financial Report:

Treasurer Fran Williams presented the Treasurer's report for the previous month.

IV. ICL Santiago Fire Relief

a. The officers considered **Resolution 010308.1**, a request from Paul and Jane Bove for funds in the amount of \$2200.00. The request was approved by voice vote of all four officers: Johnson-aye; Hunt-aye; Williams-aye; M. Schreiber-aye.

b. New Distributions:

Resolution 020508-2: A grant in the amount of \$33,362 to the Ruiz Family. The request was approved by unanimous voice vote of the ICL officers: Johnson-aye; Hunt-aye; Williams-aye; M. Schreiber-aye.

Resolution 020508-3: A grant in the amount of \$50,000 to the Carter Family. The request was approved by unanimous voice vote of the ICL officers: Johnson-aye; Hunt-aye; Williams-aye; M. Schreiber-aye.

Resolution 020508-4: A grant in the amount of \$33,892 to the McWilliams Family. The request was approved by unanimous voice vote of the ICL officers: Johnson-aye; Hunt-aye; Williams-aye; M. Schreiber-aye.

VI. Committee Reports

A. Fire Safe Council: Final evaluations with the Fire Authority Team are nearly completed. Mary Schreiber reported that the Fire Safe Council sponsorship of the Easter Breakfast will be held at the Silverado Community Center. Workers and raffle prizes are needed. Mary Schreiber also reported that the grant request for FSC funding is nearly complete.

B. Canyon Watch: Gene Robinson reported that he has turned in a "wish list" for needs on the group which will come from the \$5,000 grant money given to the group.

C. Community Directory: Betty Lowery and Joanne Hubble will meet to discuss the details of the new directory. Mary Schreiber will coordinate advertising.

VII. Old Business

Bob Hunt reported that very few hiking trails are available because of fire damage. A few remain in Black Star and Holy Jim Canyons.

VIII. New Business

A number of residents of the Baker Canyon Mobile Home Park (newly renamed Cornerstone) displayed eviction notices, given to tenants of the Park. Currently, only about 25 residents remain, and they are scheduled for eviction also. The residents have acquired a restraining order against the holder of the Lease on the property, Dan Dulac. The lease has 2 and one half years remaining, and Mr. Dulac has unsuccessfully attempted to turn the property into a Roman Catholic Retreat Center. The property owners, the Dean Family, currently reside in Amman, Jordan. After discussion, some advice was suggested, and the residents were invited to return to the March meeting to report on progress.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Fran Williams, seconded by Mary Schreiber. The meeting ended at 8:20 pm.
