#### **I. Call to Order:**

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 pm by President Deborah Johnson.

#### **II. Reading of the Minutes:**

The minutes of the previous meeting were read.. Moved by Gene Robinson and seconded by Fran Williams, minutes were approved unanimously.

#### **III. Treasurer's Report:**

Fran Williams presented the Treasurer's Report for the previous month.

#### **IV. Committee Reports:**

##### A. Santiago Fire Relief:

As of this date, no second round information has been received from the McWilliams or the Carters.

The jute cloth and hay bales will be stored until next rainy season.

##### B. Fire Safe Council:

1. First Canyon Clean Sweep netted 48 loads of brush; final weekend is June 7-8.
2. Both grants for tree removal will not be given out before October of this year.
3. Coastal Cleanup weekend will occur in mid-September.
4. Pat Antrim's new position with OCFA is Risk Assessment Officer.

C. Canyon Watch:

Gene Robinson reported that both new repeaters are up and running, and most of the new radios have been given out.

D. Cell Phone Committee:

E. Community Directory:

Joanne Hubble is now in charge of this project.

F. Brown Baggers Senior's Group:

Judy Myers reported that there are presently more members in Modjeska than Silverado. Seniors will meet in Modjeska this month.

G. History Committee:

Susan Deering has agreed to put together the book on Silverado's history.. It was moved by Mary Schreiber and seconded by Joanne Hubble to give Susan \$100 to offset some of her expenses; the book is nearly finished.

Judy Myers showed the old "Mecca of Health" decal, and asked for ideas for new decals to be made as a fund raiser for ICL; (coffee mugs, etc.)

**V. Old Business:**

A. SMPRD (Parks and Rec Board): The Children's Center has received the donation of a van from Mr. Edwards, a resident of Black Star Canyon. It is already up and running.

Fish and Game wants to take over the Saddle Peak property (about 160 acres) but does not want to take title to the land. SMPRD has offered to take title if Fish and Game can provide support monies.

According to the USGS map, the recent rain storm dropped 5-6 feet of water in just 2-3 minutes.

**VI. New Business:**

Carl Reinhart announced that he is planning a shuttle from the Canyon Market to the College. He has been working with OCTA, and will probably begin with a 10 passenger van. He hopes to be operating as early as this July.

After some discussion it was moved by Hank Rodgers, and seconded by Mary Schreiber to form a new sub-committee, the **Forest Liaison Committee**, to work with the U.S. Forestry concerning matters at the forest gate at the end of the canyon, as well as plans for the building there. The motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned by 8:47 p.m. by President Deborah Johnson.
