#### **I. Call to Order:**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Vice-President Bob Hunt.

#### **II. Reading of the Minutes:**

The minutes of the previous meeting were read, and approved as amended. Fran Williams moved the approval, Joanne Hubble seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

#### **III. Treasurer's Report:**

Fran Williams presented the Treasurer's Report for the previous month.

#### **IV. Committee Reports**

A. Fire Safe Council: Mary Schreiber reported plans are underway for Canyon Clean Sweep weekends, May 31-June 1, and June 8-9, 2008.

She announced that the next Fire Safe Council meeting is scheduled May 22, at Station 14. The time is 7:00 pm.

Rich Halsey is tentatively scheduled to report on activities of the Chaparral Institute at a Fire Safe meeting, probably in the fall.

Dennis McHale, representing Canyon Land Conservation Fund (CLCF) spoke for the group, and made several recommendations concerning the fuel modification grant.

Mary Schreiber answered questions from those attending concerning the grant, which Mary assured the group had just begun to be worked on.

B. Canyon Watch: Gene Robinson reported that Canyon Watch received two grants which will be used for mobile radios, safety vests, a new self-starting generator and a number of other items to help the canyon communities stay in contact during an emergency.

C. Cell Phone Committee: No report.

D. Community Directory Status: E-mails have been sent to 633 canyon addresses, with only a few responses so far. A next step is to contact people who do not have e-mail access.

#### **V. Old Business:**

A. SMPRD (Parks and Rec Board): Bob Hunt reported that a meeting is scheduled for May 14 at the Silverado Community Center at 7 pm to aid county planners in choosing the preferred bridge style for the new bridge at the mouth of Silverado Canyon (near the tree farm).

Plans are underway for an Adopt a Roadway Program on Santiago Canyon; trash removal will be a concern, and will be a first step towards a “scenic roadway” designation.

Irvine Ranch Conservancy is looking to a possible loop trail behind the Children’s Center, as well as a trail paralleling Black Star Canyon Road.

#### **VI. New Business:**

A. ICL will host a “Meet the Candidates” night on Wednesday, May 28.

B. Former Ambassador Joseph Wilson will meet with voters on May 21 at Irvine Lake.

C. Copies of the ICL Annual Report for 2007 were available; the report will be kept in the ICL records.
