I. The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm by President Johnson.

III. Treasurer's report was given by Treasurer Fran Williams. **A motion was made by Fran Williams, seconded by Mary Schreiber, to approve funding by ICL of \$50.00 for the recent Silverado Halloween party. The motion passed unanimously.**

A motion was made by Fran Williams, seconded by Mary Schreiber, to approve paying the veterinary bill for the Library Cat, up to \$400.00. The motion passed unanimously.

V. OLD BUSINESS:

A. SMPRD (Parks and Rec. Board): No report

B. Mike Colgan reported that the Ore Cart is ready to be moved from the school site to Silverado Community Center.

Debbie Johnson reported that Thursday, November 12 the OUSD board is scheduled to announce their determination whether our students can become part of SVSD. The County is reportedly interested in leasing Silverado School. The plans are in a very preliminary stage, but the Library could be moved there, along with several other county groups which would use the school for meeting and/or office space.

V. NEW BUSINESS:

Vicki Osborn reported that she had met with Weather Service personnel, who predicted a weak to moderate El Nino condition this winter. There is the possibility of back-to-back storms and a prediction of 13 to 17 inches of rain in December, January and February. She will meet on November 4 with the Orange County Planning Department for flood mitigation plans. Flood conditions occur when rainfall is 2.5 inches in 6 hours. The county will provide sand bags but no rice bales. Alert Orange County can be accessed by signing onto the county website.
