I. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Deborah Johnson.

II. Reading of the Minutes:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read.. Moved by Fran Williams and seconded by Gene Robinson, the minutes were approved unanimously.

III. Treasurer's Report:

Fran Williams presented the Treasurer's Report for the previous month.

IV. Committee Reports:

A. Santiago Fire Relief: It was reported that ICL is nearing the third round of fire relief.

B. Fire Safe Council: Mary Schreiber reported that FSC has received nearly 60 applications for dead and dying tree removal. She has not yet received the official letter stating that the grant is coming, but it will likely be here within the next week or two. Mary also announced that "Stay and Defend" Training will be offered from Pat Antrim's OCFA office.

C. Canyon Watch:

Gene Robinson gave a demonstration of the new "Mack Mute,." Created by Anthony Mack and his father, the device allows Canyon Watch to notify owners of the MackMute about upcoming neighborhood emergencies. He will have a training meeting soon for interested Canyon Watch members.

After some discussion a motion was made by Judy Myers, seconded by Fran Williams, to have some "Orange County, Mecca of Health" t-shirts made up as a Canyon Watch Fundraiser. The motion passed unanimously.

D. Cell Phone Committee:

Hank Rodgers has heard from Vicky Osborn, that the siren situation in the canyons would not be easily changed; the siren calls the volunteers, and can only make a single sound.

E. Community Directory: Betty Lowerey will meet with members of Brown Baggers group tomorrow, September 3, and ask for help in contacting people in Silverado, Modjeska and Williams Canyons in preparation for both the emergency call list and the new Canyons Directory. Joanne Hubble will report next meeting concerning costs for printing the Directory as well as costs for the “yellow pages” advertising section to interested parties.

F. Brown Baggers Senior’s Group: No report.

G. Forest Liaison Committee: Hank Rodgers reported that a meeting took place on August 18, with around 30 attendees, concerning the building at the end of Silverado, and the monitoring of the trailheads after the gate is opened on November 9. Several ideas were offered for use of the building.

H. Web Site Redesign : This will be discussed at the October ICL meeting.

Old Business:

SMPRD (Parks and Rec Board): Bob Hunt reported that discussion is ongoing about designating part of Santiago Canyon Road as a Scenic Highway.
