### Meeting Minutes

April 6, 2005

- I. Call to order by Deborah Johnson at 7:15 p.m.
- II. Reading of the Minutes from March 2, 2005. **Gene Robinson made a motion** to approve the minutes as read. Mary seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- III. Treasurer's report Fran Williams provided the group with a reading and a copy of the treasurer's report for the ICL, Friends of the Library and the Fire Safe Council accounts (attached). Significant items reported:
  - ICL collected and paid \$500 for the Shadybrook Memorial fund.
  - FSC received additional money, \$17,526, for the 2004-2005 grant.
  - The Easter breakfast raffle brought in \$1,262 with expenses of only \$75.41 for the DVD prize.
  - February expenses for the Library were \$456.17.
- IV. Subcommittee reports:
  - a) **Fund Raiser** – A tentative date of November 12 has been set for the faire. The Faire committee will meet the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of every month. They voted to go back to the name "Silverado Country Faire". Fran has a number of people volunteering to help this year.
  - b) **Friends of the Library** – Directories are on sale at the Library and Silverado Market. Dr. Gordon has set a date for the vaccination pet clinic, May 21, 2005. It will be at the Silverado Community Center from 9 to 11 a.m. Fran needs volunteers.
  - c) **Fire Safe Council** – May 16 has been set for the Table Top exercise, which is a table top computer simulator of an actual emergency situation in the canyons. They are creating an on-shore fire condition. Villa Park High School will be the Northwest boundary location for evacuation. Saddleback High School will be used for the South. Animal control/evacuation is being discussed as well as plans for the Silverado School/Day Care center. The FSC group is also working on a list of elderly and special care residents. Fire Safe Councils from other areas will be observing the exercise. Deborah asked how the community will be notified. After the exercise the FSC will plan how to get the word out.

Cleansweep is being planned for June. The committee is deciding whether they can do a chip or just collect. They are tentatively considering the first 2 weekends of the month.
  - d) **Canyon Watch** – Gene announced another new possible Canyon Watch volunteer. He has also recruited two new members of CREST. Both have their license and call signs. Two repeaters are up and running. Anthony Mack has a third one he will donate. He is looking for possible locations. Nothing much is happening in Modjeska. Ted Mesker is not responding to offers to help.
  - e) **Newsletter** – Deborah Johnson is trying to get a newsletter out by June.
  - f) **ICL Website** – Loyal Parsons is still willing to update – needs information sent to him. Melody will send minutes.
  - g) **History Committee** – ICL history committee is still inactive, temporarily.

V. Old Business:

- a) **Parks and Recreation Board** – Bob Hunt reported that the Orange Unified School district will not be operating the Children's Center. However, the Director has found a way to significantly lower the worker's compensation insurance costs and they are re-looking at the situation.
- b) **Water Board** – The Advisory Committee met about a week ago. 30 to 35 people attended and good suggestions were made. There will be an article about the meeting in the newspaper.
- c) **MIS Tunnel Project** – Mike Boeck reported that the public is not well represented at the meetings. A Major Investment Study was distributed at one of the meetings which included CD's. Mike shared the report with the group. There will be an important public hearing on Wednesday, April 13 at the Anaheim Hills Community Center from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m.
- d) **Storage Container** – Steve, the new caretaker at the Silverado Community Center located a resource for a long narrow container for \$200. It could fit behind the Community Center. Concerns were raised that the rats can chew through because it is made of a plastic-type material.
- a) **Silverado Canyon Ranch** – Mike Boeck announced that a supplemental EIR will be available beginning Friday April 8 for public review for 45 days.
- e) **Williams Canyon Development** – Opposition to zone changes have been registered. SMRPD is asking residents to let them know what they can live with and will support.

V. New Business:

- b) **Community Center** – Fran Williams met with the landscaper. The drip system for the community center needs a new timer. Lorraine Brown will donate funds to cover it.
